A couple of days prior to a meeting night, your President and past president are on the phone to discuss the upcoming Thursday night meeting. This involves refreshments, set up the firehouse and if Kari has to be picked up by Dennis.

Just after lunch on meeting day, another telephone contact to update the time to meet for our "sketchie" type dinner at either Wendy's, Burger King or MacDonaldis in Point Pleasant. Gary collects the homework and issues club money the YN's earn for their homework, extra credit articles for the Sand Dollar and Show and Tells. After show & tells, usually by Cedric, Jason, Michael and Kyle. Jim M covers a few of the essentials for upcoming events, exhibits, etc

Mr. C is now ready for the auction, which usually lasts to 7:25 just in time for adult auction to begin. Parents and Grandparents then gather their family members to depart as some of them do have about a half-hour drive home and now with school in session and darkness, its good to get home. The ANA has made security an integral part of its website technology. They do not share any personal information without the individual's knowledge. A password is required to gain access and should you forget it, you will receive instructions so you can change the password yourself. Your selection of a password is important as a complicated one is harder to remember as well as it would be more difficult to log into. It is suggested a password contain at least one capital letter, one symbol and at least one number.

It is a good idea to write down your password and store it in a safe place. You might abbreviate it in a way that only you will understand it.

The ANA has appointed an "Information Technology Advisory Committee that assists the ANA and its members. It is headed by Jim Reinders, an engineer at Intel Corporation in Oregon and well-known author of technical references who has worked in the supercomputer field for 27 years.

Jim is also an avid coin collector, an ANA life member, vice president of the Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association and webmaster for Portland's Willamette Coin Club.

"An antique car is in general sense of the term, is an automobile that is antique or old. Narrower definitions vary based on how old a car must be to qualify. In the United States, an antique car is generally defined as a car over 25 years of age. The antique car era includes the Veteran era, the Brass era, the Vintage era, which range from the beginning of the automobile up to the 1930's. Later cars are described as classic cars.

In original or originally restored condition, antiques are very valuable and are usually either protected and stored or exhibited in car shows, but are rarely driven."
