YOU MAY HAVE HEARD THE TERM "Short Snorter"- this is what it means:

A "Short Snorter" is a dollar bill decorated with signatures of famous people. How the name ever came into being is a mystery, but there are probably a number of reasons individuals came up with throughout the years. The signatures can be of individuals that were part of a group or of a flight crew someone was with during world war II. You can come up with your own "Short Snorter" by taking a dollar bill or even a two-dollar bill, which would be unique, ask the other YN's in the club to sign it. You then could preserve it in a plastic holder and date it. Something of a conversation item and a reminder of the members of the coin club you were a part of in past history. Show the finished product to Mr C and Jim M.
