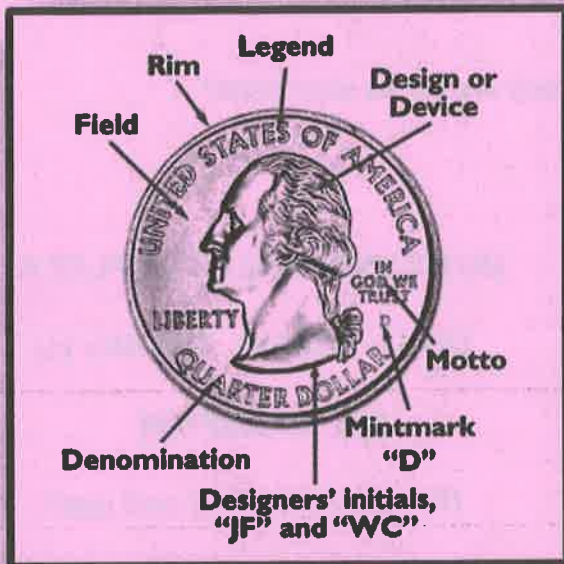

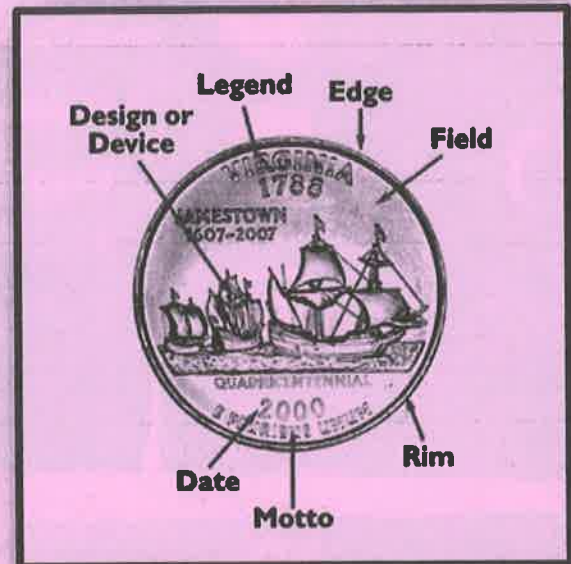
Parts of a Coin
Not just heads or tails...

Here are two images showing the different parts of a coin, including the proper names for each side of the coin.



Obverse

Obverse, or "heads" side of a 2000-D Statehood quarter. The obverse side, depicting the familiar portrait of President George Washington, was modified slightly to include some of the wording previously used on the reverse.



Reverse

Reverse, or "tails" side, of a 2000-D Statehood quarter commemorating the founding of each state. Launched in 1999, the 50 States Quarter program features five new designs per year through 2008. The "D" mint-mark in
